"COVID-19 Management in Disaster area"

Background;

The SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) Pandemic has caused over 192 million cases and 4.1 million deaths cases (As of July 21, 2021) and has been met with a global effort to counter and contain the virus. However, natural disasters are also occurring and the conditions and challenges they bring may encourage COVID-19 to spread, and impact the ability of medical forces to manage either situation. As response efforts move to restore the populations affected by disaster, they will need to keep COVID-19 in mind as a special consideration, and find the balance between COVID-19 management and disaster management. Hospitals will need extra infection control measures, and special PPE may be required. The armed forces may be required to assist with equipment transportation challenges from both the medical supply and limitation imposed by the disaster situation.

Therefore ASEAN Center of Military Medicine, as coordination node in the field of Military Medicine among ASEAN Member State (AMS) already prepared the workshop "COVID19 management in Disaster area" would be propose for approval from Board of Directors and Liaison officers which the perceived benefit for each member states is the management COVID19 in disaster area and the forthcoming comprehension for alleviate the pandemic. In addition, the collaboration among AMS and plus countries would be harmonized and standardized.
